After four terms he feels that the baton should rightly be passed to the younger members of The Rotary Club of Neutral Bay who will represent and energise this proud chapter of the organisation as it moves into the future.

Rotary International is an international service organisation whose stated purpose is to bring together business and professional leaders in order to provide humanitarian services, encourage high ethical standards in all vocations, and help build goodwill and peace in the world. It is a secular organisation open to all persons regardless of race, colour, creed, religion, gender, or political preference. Members usually meet regularly for breakfast, lunch or dinner, a social event as well as an opportunity to organize work on charitable and service goals.

One of Rotary International's proudest achievements has been the development of the Polio eradication program. The President of Rotary International, Clem Renouf (an Australian), believed that Polio could and should be eradicated. In 1988 Rotary International commenced a Polio eradication program. Since then, with the support of various governments throughout the world, major health organisations and the Bill and Melinda gates foundation, Rotary is close to achieving this goal.

US700 Million dollars is all that is required to eradicate Polio in the only three countries still affected; Pakistan, Nigeria and Afghanistan. An encouraging development in the first few months of 2013, is the report of only two cases in Pakistan and none elsewhere as compared to hundreds in 2012. The wife of our District Governor, Janelle, who is attending this function, has made her - charity of choice - the Polio eradication campaign.

Rotary's primary motto is "Service above Self". To serve we need to raise money and that is why we are here tonight: to raise money to undertake worthwhile projects. Projects that make a difference in the lives of others.

Quitting school at 18 to pursue a career as a professional pianist, he eventually emigrated to Australia where, besides playing live gigs throughout Sydney,

Svet also freelances as an audio-visual professional in postproduction of both video and audio. Trained in classical music his repertoire also includes blues and jazz alongside pop and folk music. His style is technical but always with a lot of improvisation focused on making every live gig its own unique experience.

### The Artist

#### Nick Hollo

Nick trained as an architect, has worked as an urban designer and is currently the CEO of the Sydney Harbour Federation Trust at Georges Heights.

He is also a prolific artist who includes sketching Sydney's harbour and coastline in oil pastels... often on a daily basis. He aims to capture the Harbour's beauty with his oil pastel sketches. Particular emphasis is placed on the mood and light, trying to capture the qualities and movements of the water in particular, Nick has held many exhibitions over the last decade with displays at Gallery East in Clovelly, the Museum and Art Gallery in Manly and The Mint in Sydney.
